## WIAT Woodland Management Standard

Woods should be **safe and welcoming to all**. The **standard** can be broken down into a number of criteria. FCS may choose to visit woods, however, an applicant is responsible for providing evidence that these criteria are being met.

**Note:** if the woodland has an approved Forest Plan and evidence is provided that it is being managed according to a recognised Quality Standard (e.g. Green Flag) then FCS will not require the above evidence.
