# Creation of Chough Nest Shelter

Date published: 30 March, 2015

Note: In September 2023, references to Scottish Natural Heritage have been updated to NatureScot.

#### **Aim**

The aim of this item is to benefit chough by providing suitable nest sites through construction of a shelter.

Chough traditionally nest in caves or abandoned farm buildings. These can become too derelict for the chough to use, or lost altogether due to redundant buildings being converted to housing.

### **Eligibility**

Any grassland, including rough grassland, close to existing or recently used chough nest sites is eligible.

You must combine this item with at least one of the following management options:

- Chough Mown Grassland
- Chough Grazing Management

### <u>Application requirements</u>

You must identify the location of the proposed chough nest shelter on a 1:10,000 map.

#### Requirements

- you must obtain planning permission, or have confirmation that planning permission is not required, for your proposed nest shelter
- you must construct the shelter in accordance with published guidance
- the shelter must be secured or anchored to the ground
- the nest shelter must include at least one nesting platform inside of approximately one square metre, located in either gable end, or on the centre of the back wall. The location of the platform must be agreed with NatureScot
- · you must not use the nest shelter for storage or livestock housing
- · you must maintain a diary

#### **Payment**

You can claim £4,518 per shelter.

## <u>Inspections</u>

The inspectors will check:

- the location of the work
- you have constructed the shelter in accordance with published guidance
- the shelter is secured or anchored to the ground
- the nest shelter includes at least one nesting platform inside of approximately one square metre, located in either gable end, or on the centre of the back wall. The location of the platform must be agreed with NatureScot
- you are not using the nest shelter for storage or livestock housing
- you have maintained a diary
