If your application for funding is successful you must inform the public about the support you receive.

If you have a website for professional use, you must place on your website a short description of the project where a link between the purpose of the website and the support provided to the project can be established and highlighting the financial support received.

If you receive funding of more than €50,000 you must put up an explanatory plaque with information about your project and highlighting the financial support you receive.

All plaques must include:

- the European emblem in accordance with the standards detailed in EU Commission Regulation 808/2014 Annex III Part 2
- the statement "The European Agriculture Fund for Rural Development: Europe investing in rural areas"
- a description of the project which shall take up at least 25 per cent of the plaque

The emblem should be as per the standards presented on the [European Union website](#).

If you fail to erect a plaque we may seek the recovery of payments made to you for the project in question.

Examples of suitable wording for plaques:
