Sharing your information

We will pass on your personal information if we have a legal obligation to do so or if we have to enforce or apply our terms of use and other data sharing agreements.

- Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) for purposes connected with animal and plant health and welfare
- organisations carrying out statistical and research activities, including the collection of agricultural data under section 78 (as amended) of the Agriculture Act (1947) and to meet European Commission Statistical Regulations
- organisations which audit the distribution of grants and subsidies in Scotland
- (contact information only) other organisations, for the purpose of improving or streamlining public service delivery, or to support public functions for which it is necessary for a public body to contact land managers and farmers
